Many members of George and Joan's family travelled here for the occasion they were also members of rotary, woodworkers, scouts, council representatives including our mayor, as well as a big contingent of our volunteers.

I just wanted to share with you part of the speech I wrote which will hopefully explain a bit to those of you who weren't lucky enough to meet George just a few of the things he did for this area and the kind of man he was.

Over the years George was involved in many different organisations in the area including woodworkers, rotary, scouts, cricket and rugby league where he was coaching and refereeing. George put his heart soul and passion into everything he was involved in not for any recognition but for the good of the organisation and its members and he certainly benefited the Parkyn Hut team when the Hut first opened over 18 years ago.

George was the one to organise fitting it out with shelves tables stools etc.

Before workplace health and safety came into play he would regularly bring his ladder down to the Hut get up on the roof to clean off all the fallen leaves give the Hut a wash down and do any odd jobs around the place that needed doing.

George relished his role as Historian and often went to local schools to talk to the children about the history of the area. He was also involved in organising our annual Pioneers Luncheon and Tewantin Heritage Walk.. I was lucky enough to work in the Hut every Tuesday afternoon for many years with George and his wonderful wife Joan, before she passed away. We all had a great time working together, but I also learnt so much about this wonderful community we live in from this amazing couple.

George always used to say to me you shouldn't go to bed at night unless you've learnt something new that day. And let me tell you, I never had any trouble going to bed on the Tuesday night after spending the afternoon with George and Joan. People would often pop in to the Hut on the Tuesday afternoon just to ask George questions about the town's history or to share their stories with him. He was always so giving of his time.

A question that George was frequently asked was, "How long do you have to live here to become a local?" and George's answer was simply ... "when you start being involved and giving back to the community you become a local." Very wise words indeed.!

Free late-night Go Noosa Loop Bus arrives for Christmas

A FREE Park-and-Ride Loop Bus will hit the road this festive season as part of Council's Christmas Go Noosa transport campaign.

It's in addition to the popular free holiday buses, which again return in the lead up to Christmas – December 14 – and will continue to offer free transport through until January 27.

"The new Loop Bus is a brand new initiative designed to take the stress out of getting around key precincts and help ease congestion and demand for parking in the busiest centres," Or Brian Stockwell said

The bus will depart the Noosa Heads bus terminal every 15 minutes in a clockwise loop along Noosa Drive, Weyba Road, and Noosa Parade. It will also operate at night, half-hourly from 7pm to 10pm.

"The night time service means people can jump straight on to a bus near where they're staying, head off to a restaurant to enjoy a night out, then find their way home again quickly and easily on the bus for free," Cr Stockwell said.

"Passengers can get on and off the bus at Noosa Heads Bus Station, temporary stops opposite The J, the TransLink stops at Williams Street and Quamby Place, plus the Weyba Road football club, which is our major park-and-ride location, with parking for up to 400 vehicles."

Traffic controllers will help pedestrians cross busy roads around Hastings Street and assist buses to get in and out of the traffic quickly.

"We'll be taking this a step further this year with the trial of a bus queue-jump on Noosa Parade on the approach to Hastings Street to ensure the buses keep moving.

"We'll need to remove a small number of parking spaces to make way for the temporary bus queue-jump lane, but they'll be more than made up for at the Weyba Road park-and-ride facility.

"The State Government has confirmed we can continue to use Noosa Heads Lions Park for our popular paid carpark for this Christmas and next Easter. That will be operated by the Tewantin-Noosa Lions Club," Cr Stockwell said.

"We've upped the Lions Club's percentage of the proceeds to 50% and the remainder will again fund the Go Noosa transport initiatives."

Cr Stockwell said residents and visitors should download the Go Noosa app for real time bus information and car parking availability.

"By checking the app you can quickly decide the best place to park to catch either a free holiday bus, or the new free shuttle, to get into Hastings Street.

"Congestion will always be an issue in peak periods – that is a fact of life at popular holiday destinations all over the world. But with Go Noosa, we're aiming to provide multiple options so that visitors and locals can make their way into our busiest centres easily and stress free."

\$2.8M contract awarded for 'blackspot' intersection upgrade

A notorious Noosa traffic 'blackspot' will be upgraded in the coming months after the awarding a \$2.8M construction contract for the job.

PentaCon Pty Ltd will start work on the Ernest Street/Hilton Terrace intersection upgrade at the end of January.

The project includes a new roundabout, plus on-road cycle lanes, pedestrian safety improvements, and a new pavement for Hilton Terrace.

The project will also deliver renewed landscaping, signage and stormwater infrastructure.

"The focus is on improving safety at this intersection, which has been the scene of numerous crashes in recent times," Mayor Tony Wellington said.

"A recent transport study identified this intersection as being the most in need of an upgrade across all our Council controlled intersections, with more than 17,000 vehicle movements at this junction daily.

"It's a real blackspot where traffic regularly queues at peak times as vehicles wait to turn right from Ernest Street on to Hilton Terrace,"

"We've been busy working with service providers to relocate underground services so that we are now able to press on with this much needed upgrade." Cr Wellington said.

PentaCon Pty Ltd was among six companies to tender for the job.

"Work will commence soon after Australia Day and we'll be striving to ensure it's completed before Easter,"

"Obviously, there will be some traffic delays during construction but Council and the contractor will ensure the community is well informed as work progresses."

2020 : Year of the Rat

See the following table for the full details of each year.

The Rat is the first of all zodiac animals. According to one myth, the Jade Emperor said the order would be decided by the order in which they arrived to his party. The Rat tricked the Ox into giving him a ride. Then, just as they arrived at the finish line, Rat jumped down and landed ahead of Ox, becoming first.

The Rat is also associated with the Earthly Branch (地支—dì zhī) Zi (子) and the midnight hours.

In the terms of yin and yang (阴阳—yīn yáng), the Rat is yang and represents the beginning of a new day.

In Chinese culture, rats were seen as a sign of wealth and surplus. Because of their reproduction rate, married couples also prayed to them for children.

Rats are clever, quick thinkers; successful, but content with living a quiet and peaceful life.

Recent years of the Rat are: 1924, 1936, 1948, 1960, 1972, 1984, 1996, 2008, 2020.

Paired with the Celestial Stems (天 干—Tiān gān), there is a 60-year calendrical cycle. Although zi is associated with water, the years also cycle through the five elements of nature (五行—wǔ xíng).

Metal	1960, 2020	These Rats tend to be reliable and live a stable life. They may hold some power and are able to turn unlucky events into fortune.

Wood	1924, 1984	These Rats are multi-talented. They are strong- willed and always finish what they begin.
Fire	1936, 1996	These Rats have high IQs and EQs. They are average during youth, develop well in the middle ages and have great fortune later in life.
